Albert Clark Fawcett was born August 21, 1933 in Springdale, UT and passed peacefully June 6, 2017 in Hurricane, UT. He had dreamed for many years of returning to Utah, he was very happy when they did so in 2002.

He is survived by his spouse of 55 years, Jill; a son, Lance; 2 daughters Christy Vohringer and Tisha McCorkell; 9 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren. He is predeceased by 2 daughters Julieann and Jillnita; and a grandchild.

He moved to Southern California as a child. He was a dedicated member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and served a 2-year mission in Hawaii. He served his country for 2 years in the U.S. Army. He was a California peace officer for 21 years during which time he obtained his Bachelors of Science in Public Management from Pepperdine University.

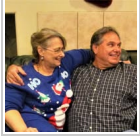

“ Some of my first memories of Uncle Clark was before he married Aunt Jill, and my family would visit him in the San Bernardino California mountains where he worked as a County Sheriff. When Aunt Jill and Uncle Clark moved to Highland/San Bernardino I remember that they had an abundant producing plum tree in the backyard and also a German Shepherd dog. If I remember right, my family's line of German Shepherd's originated from Clark's German Shepherd.

When Clark and Jill moved to Rialto California I was envious, because the cousins at the time lived close to each other in Rialto (Catherine's, Norene's, and Ted's families). When Clark and Jill moved to Rialto there were three cousin families in the same neighborhood, which made visiting all of them on the same day easy.

Eventually, all the cousins moved from Rialto, and Clark's family moved back to the mountains to Running Springs into a really nice log cabin home. Clark would stop by my family's home often to visit in his Sheriff's car, and I remember one time when he was visiting that he went into action as a Sheriff by stopping traffic after a lighting bolt downed a power line into the wet roadway next to our home.

When Clark retired from the Sheriff's Department he became a Pipefitter Welder, and I had the privilege of working on the same jobs as he did, and also as his working partner. I remember one day that I was working with Clark and I got pulled away by some men, in order to help try and pull with a rope some heavy duty pipe that was caked with coal slurry out from underneath the coal hopper. Five two hundred pound men, myself included, unsuccessfully struggled for several minutes to pull the pipe out from underneath the coal hopper. Clark showed up and witnessed our struggle pulling on the rope, and he was a bit irritated that I had been gone so long. He demanded that all of us men step back and cease trying to pull the pipe from underneath the hopper. Then Clark singly took the rope and swung his arm so the rope twisted around his large arm. He then leaned backwards and all by himself pulled the pipe out from underneath the coal hopper, which five of us grown men couldn't

*budge. One of the men turned to me and exclaimed, "Jimmy, please remind me of this moment if I ever get angry with Clark. I mean it!" Uncle Clark was a giant, but gentle man, who I respected deeply.*
