He married Leann Smart, truly the love of his life on January 19, 1993. She brought 4 children into their marriage. Jeremy Whiting (Brandi), Sara Cox (Jeremy), Thomas Whiting (Molly) and Taylor Whiting (Amy). Bill and Leann had William "Billy" Frank Nebeker Jr (Ashley) who became their 14th child.

Being a dad and grandpa was the biggest joy. He loved them with his whole heart. He enjoyed taking them on rides and telling them stories about each place. He would do as much as possible to help each of them through their trials and celebrated their achievements. He absolutely loved to plan family vacations that they went on each year.

Bill Worked for the post office for 30 years. He was a mail carrier and moved up where he became the Manager of Consumer Affairs. He loved all those he worked with over the years there.

When He retired, he chose to get a CDL and become a bus driver. He thoroughly enjoyed the job of taking passengers all over the place. He worked for commercial bus lines and schools where he took school groups on activities. He always had a basket of candy to share and numerous stories while they were traveling. He took a group of senior citizens once and asked if anyone needed a bathroom break. One lady said they called it “fluffing their pillows”. That term took and used it with all his future trips. He loved being at the local grocery store and getting a hug from a student, calling him “Bus driver Bill”. He also had the opportunity to drive for the 2002 Winter Olympics, which he absolutely loved. He loved being in the middle of any event.

Bill followed in his father footsteps and became an announcer at the July 24th, pioneer parade. He and his family slept over the night before the parade where they set up BBQs and treats. At the end of the parade, he would get up on the announcing van and ride through the route thanking everyone for coming.

Bills parents loved being part of the Hopis friends. They traveled to the reservation during his childhood. He still has many friends that he kept in contact with. Over 10 years he became Santa’s helper, and he took games, fruit and clothing, and even coats. Wrapping gifts was part of the fun too. He

invited church youth groups to help, He and his friends and family made Christmas stockings every December. He held each child on his lap and gave them their presents. He loved doing that every year while he was still well. He loved at being a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints to the fullest. He served in many callings including Bishop, Branch President, High Council and even working as the ward librarian.
