Carol Jones, 92, passed away peacefully on April 17, 2024. She was born to goodly parents Viola (Condie) and Lovell Stokes. Carol joined her parents, her four brothers, Gary, Wayne, Bob and Gordon, and her husband Robert in their spiritual home. She was surrounded by her loving family when she died in San Jose, California.

Born in Wyoming, she also lived in Utah, Colorado, Illinois, and California. She was married to Robert Jones for 68 years. Their marriage was sealed in the Mormon Temple in Salt Lake City. In 1986 she and Robert moved to Toquerville, Utah. They loved living in Utah for over 30 years. Robert passed in 2020 and Carol relocated to California in 2022 to be closer to her sons and extended family. Carol was a gentle, patient, kind and unselfish soul survived by her three sons, three daughters-in law, five grandchildren, and two great grandchildren.

Carol worked many years in Silicon Valley in production operations. She was a resourceful and brave woman who became the primary caregiver for her husband for over 30 years while managing the entire household, finances and raising her three children.

Carol's fighting spirit, independence and loving personality endured throughout her life. Even with her sudden illness, she continued to drive her

own car on local shopping trips and errands including weekly visits to her favorite hairdresser.

Always unselfish and never thinking of herself, she loved to attend family events, school graduations and holiday functions. She enjoyed meeting friends and family for lunch, and she loved to shower her great grandchildren with gifts even when it meant giving up something for herself. She never forgot to call and write birthday cards, holiday cards and special notes to family.

Even in her 90's, Carol's mind was sharp, and she enjoyed playing card games, especially Cribbage. Before her arm was injured in a car accident, she was active in several bowling leagues and was extremely proud of having an article in the local St. George newspaper about her bowling achievement. Carol held the DWBA record for bowling a 299 game at Brentwood Bowl. This was the highest scoring game ever bowled by a woman in Washington County at that time.
