Carrie Lea Manis Toquerville, UT--Carrie Lea Manis, age 69, was relieved from her pain and called home to her Heavenly Father after a brief battle with pancreatic cancer on April 7, 2018. She was born to Howard and Hazel Fuller in Memphis, Tennessee on December 10, 1948. She was married to John W. Manis in the Provo, UT LDS Temple on February 21, 1975.

Carrie was raised in Tennessee where she developed her Southern charm and drawl that would manifest itself any time she came in touch with her heritage throughout life (despite being “dried out in the desert” as she always claimed). She was a convert to The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in her late teens and served a mission to the Colorado-New Mexico Mission as a young woman. Following her mission, she earned Bachelor and Master of Education degrees from Brigham Young University. She spent the majority of her married life raising a family in Las Vegas, NV and serving in the Church in many leadership positions as well as having a special gift for teaching.
