They spent the early years of their marriage in Idaho Falls where her husband was in the trucking business. They were the co-owner of Teton Trading and Transportation Co., hauling freight to Jackson, WY. In 1954, they moved to Jackson and continued the freight business. Later they bought a dry cleaning business and operated it for several years. They were also owners of the Kelly Canyon Ski Area in Ririe, ID.

She was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and held many positions. Doline was always known for her positive attitude. She always had a smile on her face and a song in her heart. She was everyone's friend. She enjoyed family gatherings, arts and crafts, her

grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. She sang in the church choir and also in the movie Spencer's Mountain filmed in Jackson, WY.
