In 2001 Dominic and his family relocated to Hurricane, Utah where he attended Hurricane Middle and then went on to attend and graduate from Hurricane High School. Dom’s academics always involved sports and with his athletic performance exceeding his peers, Dom soon became known for his passion and skills on the field and court. Many people here today to pay their respects have known Dom since these earlier years and can attest to the all-around fun-loving spirit Dom presented everywhere he went and his ability to make people feel seen and loved.

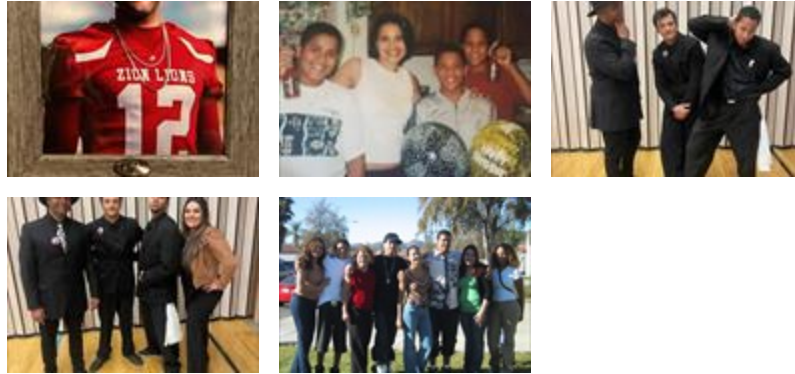

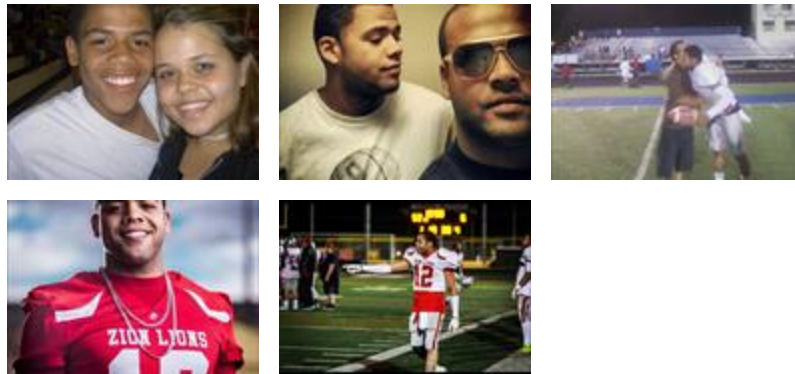
