Donna Dastrup Kidman, 70, passed away on June 8, 2013, at the El Camino Hospital in Mountain View, CA. She was born January 2, 1943, in Los Angeles, CA, to L. Garn and Naomi Friedman Dastrup.

Donna spent her early years both in Siguard, UT and Salt Lake City, UT, until the death of her mother when she was five years old. She then moved to Siguard to live with her paternal grandparents. She also lived with her maternal grandmother in southern California. She moved back to Salt Lake City, where she graduated high school. Shortly thereafter, she met Gary L.
