covered wagon rides and she also shared her gift of music by playing the accordion for the riders while riding in the wagon. She had a homemade bakery where everything was made from scratch. Jay always said it was more of a hobby to Dorothy than a business because she gave away just as much as she sold. For many years, Jay and Dorothy enjoyed delivering ice cream to many places such as Kanab, Panguitch, Ruby's Inn out by Price and many other places. They made lots of friends and found many restaurants they loved to eat at. Dorothy had a Flea Market with Jay and Rosanne (Daughter).

Dorothy was very active in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. She served in many positions, such as Relief Society and Primary Dorothy was also very active in the community.
