Douglas Reed Metcalf passed away suddenly on Tuesday, September 22, 2020, in St. George, UT, from injuries sustained in a vehicle collision. Doug was born in Salt Lake City, UT, and spent the first 13 years of his life growing up in Southern California. He and his family later moved back to Salt Lake City where he graduated Granite High School (1967), Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Utah (Magna Cum Laude), and received his MBA from Brigham Young University specializing in Finance (CFA). He also served an honorable mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Southeast Mexico from 1968-1970. In 1972, Doug married his forever companion, Nancy Hellewell Metcalf, in the Salt Lake Temple.

Doug was a lifelong learner and was excited by all of life's wonderful possibilities. He and Nancy were world travellers; they and their family lived in many beautiful locations throughout the United States, finding wonderful friends wherever they lived. Even retired, Doug was still taking classes in Entrepreneurship and Business Management at the local university.

I’m forever grateful for having the chance to experience 16 years with an incredible Papa, father-figure, and mentor.

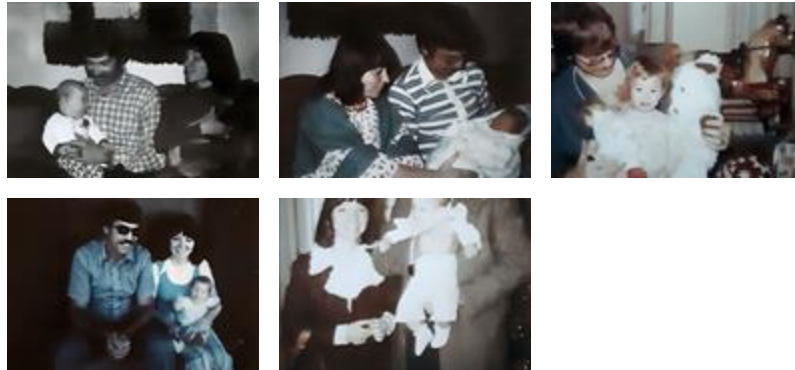

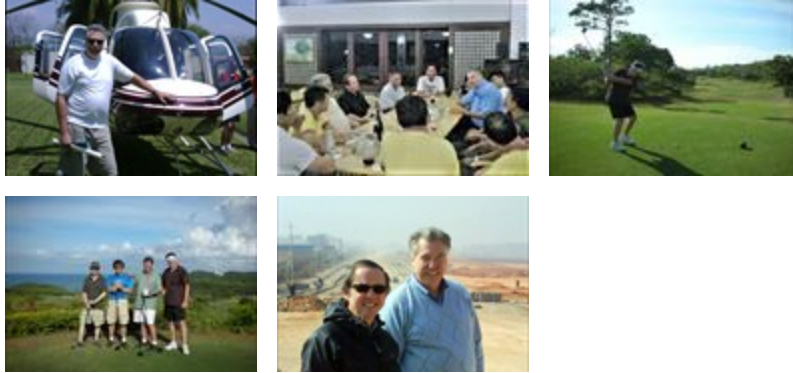
