event planning, baking and making treats, sharing her popcorn balls, famous caramels, and holiday candies with friends and family.

The gospel played an important part in Drinda's life. She enjoyed each calling she was given and loved to share her faith with others. Aside from her faith in Jesus Christ, she valued family and friends the most. Service to family and others was a big part of her life whether it was making baby blankets or crocheting afghans, sewing or canning from her garden, she gave and shared in abundance without hesitation or expectation of anything in return.

She was a wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, sister, teacher, friend, and confidant. She touched and imparted her wisdom on everyone she encountered.
