Edward "Eddie" Dorsey was born June 8, 1953 in Richmond Virginia. He died January 25, 2024, after complications secondary to Covid at the age of 70.

He was the son of Edward G Dorsey Jr. and Mintie Covington Dorsey. At the age of 5 he and his family moved from Richmond to Brigham City Utah for his father's work at Thiokol. He graduated from Brigham City High School and attended Utah State University. He married Elizabeth (Betty) VanderStappen September 4, 1982, and was a loving husband for over 41 years.

Eddie worked for the Utah Driver's License Department for 15 years in the Salt Lake and Moab offices. He also spent time as a psych tech and went on to become a radiology technician in Pueblo Colorado and Page Arizona.

He was an avid skier and spent many happy days at Beaver Mtn in Logan Canyon. He loved to hike, camp, golf and enjoy being outdoors especially in the Southwest. He spent the last 16 years in St George Utah.

He is survived by his wife Betty, daughter Jessica Pauline Dorsey, one grandson Aiden Edward Dorsey "the bear" who was the apple of his eye. His sister Martha Ward and brother-in-law Dale Ward of Brigham City and numerous nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents.

Ed, Paul and I drove a 51 chevy from SLC to New York and flew to England. From there we spent about 3 months hitch hiking all the way to Greece. A couple yrs after Europe, Ed and I road motorcycles through Mexico to its southern border. And maybe a year after Mexico, we drove Ed’s old VW jeep Thing to Alaska. Spending the whole summer camping and driving.

Those were all great adventures that we shared.

Ed and I were room mates at the University when Ed met and married Betty. And Betty was loving and spectacular for Ed in every way. Ed and Betty and Deb and I were great friends. My sympathies and love go to Betty and their family. We will all miss Ed very very much.
