Franklin J. Slack, 76, passed away on December 4, 2015, in St. George, UT. He was born December 25, 1938, in Cedar City, UT to John Calvin and Mae Wright Slack. He married Sandra Decker Slack in Parowan, UT on August 23, 1957.

Frank was raised and went to school in Cedar City, UT. He left school at the beginning of his senior year to serve his country in the U.S. Air Force. He travelled worldwide and retired honorably November 1, 1976. After retirement, he brought his family to live in Parowan, UT. He served as a Parowan police officer and later went to the Iron Country Sherriff's office where he served proudly for 20 years before retiring in 1997.

Frank was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and a member of the Cedar City 19th Ward. Frank and Sandra were sealed in the Salt Lake Temple May 26, 1965. In his spare time, Frank liked to travel, going to flea markets and yard sales, tinkering on stuff in his shop and cleaning everything in sight.
