Geneva went to elementary, junior and senior high school in Evanston, Wyoming. She graduated from the University of Utah with a B.S. in Nursing. She retired after 30+ years at the Veteran's Administration Medical Center in Salt Lake City, Utah. At retirement she was the Assistant Chief Nurse of Surgical Nursing. She loved her nursing career and the VA hospital.

She married Anthony Joseph Butkovich (dec). They lived their entire married life in Salt Lake City, Utah. Geneva maintained lifelong friends, both from her medical career and being a part of Utah Elks Association with A.J. We would have missed knowing many wonderful people, had they not been members of BPOE. When A.J. died she moved to St. George, Utah in 2006. (Smartest move she ever made).
