On April 1, 2022, Georgia Ruth Thompson completed her earthly adventure here in mortality, and moved on to her next adventure in her progression to be like our Lord and Savior and our Father in Heaven. Georgia was Born May 9, 1945, in Littlefield Texas. Georgia was raised in Texas and did ballet and was part of a singing group. 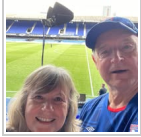
