As we reflect on our earlier years together with her in Silverdale, WA, we remember how generous she was in sharing her many talents and wisdom with others. For example, when Jane heard that we were taking our oldest son to Europe (after his mission) and that we knew little about the areas we were planning to visit; she prepared an extensive and detailed itinerary for us ... not wanting us to miss important places and experiences.
