



Jenae Marble Anderson

July 7, 1929 - June 17, 2016

Jenae Marble Anderson was born July 7, 1929, in Tremonton, UT to Nathaniel Earl Marble and Naomi Marie Hansen Marble, and passed away at her home June 17, 2016.

Jenae was raised in Tremonton, UT and attended Box Elder High School, class of 1947. Jenae was the co-editor of her high school yearbook. She married Ernest Ardell Anderson November 21, 1946 at the Marble Motel, which was operated by her parents. She and Ernest were later divorced.

She is survived by three children: Kim M, Naomi Lin (Daniel) Moss, and Kyle C (Carol Flowers) Anderson, 14 grandchildren and 25 great grandchildren. She is also survived by sisters, Linda (Herman) Hatch, Emilee (Barry) Bunker and a brother-in-law, Larry Garfield. She is preceded in death by her daughter JeNean Carver, her parents, sister Leanne, and her brother Nolan.

Besides being a mother, grandmother and great grandmother, she had many jobs in her life. She started her careers as a soda jerk in Tremonton, then after she married, she was a waitress in Centerville, moving on to work as a title clerk, real estate agent, manager at Bountiful Bowl, police dispatcher, police officer, detective, administrative assistant for the detectives in Bountiful, UT, and she operated a dress shop on Main Street in Bountiful before she retired.

She was very active in bowling during her life, being in many leagues, acting as league secretary and president and participated in many tournaments, traveling all over the country. She won one tournament in Nevada that was open to both men and women. She was active in the Ladies Jaycees as a younger wife, traveling to many cities for conventions. She helped organize July 4th celebrations in Centerville, and also was a Santa's helper for many Christmases in Centerville in the 1950s and 1960s.

During her life, she had the opportunity to travel throughout Europe (England 3 times), China and all 50 states and Canada. In 1993, she was called to serve a proselyting mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to the Fort Lauderdale, Florida Mission. She also served in many other callings in the LDS Church in her life, including in Young Women's, Primary and Relief Society.

Funeral Services will be held Friday, June 24th, 2016 at the Ivins, UT Center Street Chapel at 11:00 a.m., with a viewing starting at 9:30 a.m. prior to the services.

Interment with graveside services will be held in the Deweyville, UT cemetery on Saturday, June 25th, 2016 at 2:00 p.m.
