Jerald Keith LeFevre passed away peacefully Sunday evening, August 23. Jerald was born April 25, 1941 in Panquitch, Utah to James Jay LeFevre and Betty Jo Worthen. He graduated from Hurricane High School in 1959, all the while working after school at Clifton's Market.
