Johnny Lee Moore, 56, of Apple Valley, Utah (originally from Charleston, West Virginia) passed away after a long battle with cancer on February 4, 2017.

John was a courageous warrior throughout his battle with melanoma and made it his goal to promote melanoma awareness. He participated in newspaper and television interviews and talked of his cancer experience in the documentary "Moonshot: Through the Double Helix" produced by Dixie State University in St. George, Utah.

John was a previous employee of the Arizona Port of Entry. He was a gifted artist and created various works of art through different media including airbrushing and welding. His favorite pastime was to go exploring in the Jeep or the rail buggy into the surrounding desert of the Arizona Strip. John's love of music will leave fond memories of "rockin' out" to his favorite tunes for many of you.


Preceding John in death are his parents, Jess Homer Moore and Betty Lorine Anderson Moore, and his beloved Great Dane, Newt.

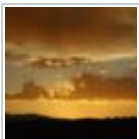
