November 23, 1945 - September 3, 2017

Saint George, UT –Judy Hutchinson, age 71, passed away on September 3, 2017. She was born on November 23, 1945 to John and Mildred Joseph in Chicago, Illinois. She met her life-long partner, Will Hutchinson, in Half Day, Illinois, and was married on June 10, 1967, in Rolling Meadows, Illinois.

Judy grew up in Chicago, Illinois where she attended Walsh Elementary and graduated from Harrison High School in January 1964. Some of her activities in high school included the Cappella Choir, Girls Chorus, Treble Choir, Student helper, Girls Athletic Association, Sten Club, Co-Captain Usherettes, Student Council, Future Teachers of America and Girls Bowling.

Judy had many hobbies and interests such as hiking National Park trails during our many vacations. She loved the social aspects of bowling and also the walking & talking group with the Dixie Social Club. She loved to visit Las Vegas and Laughlin, Nevada for the shopping, shows, food and slot machines.

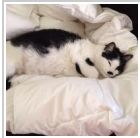

“ To Judy Hutchinson,
The Love Of My Life

I found Judy at a young adults' dance club in Half Day, Illinois, in the winter of 1965. She was with female friends from work whom I had met the week before, and asked one of them to meet me at the club the next weekend. When I asked the young lady to dance that next weekend, she turned me down. I immediately asked Judy to dance, and she said yes. We danced together all evening and Judy was accused of stealing the other young lady's date. Oh well.

I fell in love with Judy within a few weeks but didn't think I was ready to get married. Like a fool, I told her I thought we should see other people. Realizing how stupid I was, I begged Judy to take me back. She agreed. We continued to see each other for the next year and I finally told her that we were going to get married (I did not ask). She agreed. After much worry and fear, I asked Judy's father for her hand in marriage. We were engaged on Christmas Day, 1966.

We were married on June 10, 1967, in Rolling Meadows, Illinois, in the middle of a tremendous rain storm that flooded the church basement and Judy's father's car. Judy's aunt made the statement that rain on our wedding day would bring good luck, although I doubt Judy's father agreed with her at that time. It proved to be true for us for 50 years.

As a young married couple, we both worked to save for a house. I worked at an Army Missile Base as a civilian technician, and Judy worked as a Secretary for an engineering firm. Many times I worked a 24-hour shift. When I came home in the morning, Judy would be going to work. This was not a good situation for a young married couple. I quickly found another job that allowed us to be together every night.

We were in the process of buying our first house in Streamwood, Illinois, the same day Neil Armstrong landed on the moon, July 20,

1969. Judy always wanted us to own our own home before we started a family. Our son, Mark, was born a few years later on December 24, 1971 while "Little Drummer Boy" was playing over the public address system in the delivery room. Judy always loved that Christmas carol.

We purchased our second (somewhat bigger) home in Mt. Prospect, Illinois, in 1973. Our youngest son, Eric, was born August 4, 1975. The day Judy went to the hospital to deliver him, we were held up by The American Freedom Train passing through Mt. Prospect, Illinois, celebrating the 200th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence. Although we had to take a different route, we still made it to the hospital in time.

When our boys were old enough to go to school, Judy volunteered at their school. She said it was for her to keep busy. I think it was to keep an eye on the administration and teachers to make sure things were being done correctly. When the boys were in high school, Judy started working for the Gifted Department Coordinator in the Des Plaines, Illinois, School District. After "training" a couple of different coordinators, she really enjoyed working and continued until we moved to St. George, Utah, in 1997. While working at the school district, she made some very special friends. She kept in touch with them and got together for lunch each year when we visited the Midwest.

Our two sons, Mark and Eric, were the love of Judy's life. Although both are married, Mark to April, and Eric to Ji Young, they remained Mommy's little boys. Without fail, Judy talked with them by phone and later Skyped with them every week. She loved seeing our granddaughters Isabelle, Mary, Rita, and Lucy on the computer to find out how they were doing and what they had planned for the week ahead. She also loved both daughters-in-law, April and Ji Young, very much.

Thank you, sweetheart, for 50 wonderful years of marriage celebrated on June 10, 2017. I'm not going to talk about anything

after our anniversary as I want only good memories to remain. I will miss you forever.
