Lance R. Voss, 74, died August 3rd, 2025, at his home in Hurricane, Utah.

A celebration of life service will be held on August 14th, 2025, at his former residence of 698 W. 375 S. Hurricane, Utah from 4pm to 6pm.

Lance was born July 1st, 1951, in Rock Springs, Wyoming to Raymond "Whitey" Voss and Violet Wilkerson Voss.

A graduate of Evanston High School in Evanston, Wyoming in 1969, he went on to marry his High School sweetheart, Rhonda Deanin 1970. He attended Weber State University and built his first home in North Ogden, Utah. He later moved his family to Evanston, Wyoming.

He is survived by his three children, Heather Jean (Bryan) Johnson, Jason Robert Voss, and Hailey Colleen (Corey) Welling, along with 10 grandchildren, and 6 great-grandchildren. Lance is preceded in death by his parents, a sister Connie Rae Robbins, and his first wife Rhonda to whom he was married 31 years.

Lance was an accomplished carpenter. His construction business, Woodcrafters, was known all over southwest Wyoming, especially his detailed finish work. He spent some time in politics, serving as a City Councilman in Evanston in the 1980's. He later entered into the electronic era in the 1990's and started a computer sales and service business, PC Innovation, in Evanston, Wyoming.

Lance was known to be generous to those whom he felt needed assistance and was willing to talk to just about anyone about any subject under the sun.

He loved to travel, going as far as Spain and Hawaii, enjoyed reading Louis L'Amour novels, fishing, hunting, and shooting firearms for sport. A few years after Rhonda's untimely death in 2003, he met and married Crystal Hill of Phoenix, Arizona. They eventually moved to Hurricane, Utah and were married 17 years. Following their divorce, Lance spent his last few years working on computers and being a friendly neighbor. He was a lifelong member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
