We've been going there on Sundays for about a year. When I first got there and began meeting the people we were called to serve, I was immediately drawn to Laraine. She had a beautiful smile and a sparkle in her eyes. I could tell she was a beauty in her day. I know she couldn't remember me from one Sunday to the next, but she was so happy and friendly towards me. As a presidency, we always tried to spread out among the people during Sacrament meeting, but I pretty much made it a point to always sit by Laraine. I watched her decline over this past year, at first she could sing the familiar songs. I would offer her the song book but she would say she couldn't see the words. These last months she did not sing, she barely talked, but she always aroused when the Sacrament was being passed. She could not pick up the Sacrament cup, but it was my pleasure to help her get the cup to her lips. I shed many tears of gratitude for this humbling experience.

I want to share my last experience with Laraine on the Sunday before she passed. She was very drowsy from the very beginning of the service, her head drooped, eyes closed. She didn't respond to me at all. Then as the Sacrament hymn music began to play, she sat up a bit and opened her eyes. Her shaking hand reached towards the hymn book I was holding and I knew she wanted to hold the book. I sat it in her lap open to the hymn "I Know That My Redeemer Lives." She stared down at the words - unable to sing or say a word. I want you to know that she was singing those words in her heart. I had such a confirmation that it was one of her favorite hymns. I knew this was a woman who loved the Savior. I thought at that moment that she was not going to be here much longer. That brief moment was a tender mercy from God that I was allowed to experience. And then the next Sunday when I arrived at the Beehive House, my husband told me Laraine had passed earlier in the week. My heart ached for a moment because I will miss her. But, I am so grateful she is with her dear husband and freed from the body and mind that had given out. I loved this precious woman. I wish all of
