Larena Lee Batty passed away on January 30th, 2022, at the age of 71 in the Neurorestorative nursing home in Riverton, Utah, after a battle with a stroke and cancer.

Larena grew up in Virgin, Utah where she spent her childhood swimming in the Virgin River, riding horses with her siblings, and helping out on the farm. Larena attended high school in Hurricane, Utah where she graduated in 1968. She obtained a bachelor's degree from Southern Utah State College in Elementary Education. She taught third grade at Hurricane Elementary where she met her eternal companion, S. Alan Batty from Cedar City.

Larena and Alan were married in the St. George, Utah temple in 1982. She was a dedicated mother and was always there for her kids and family. She loved to spend time with her sisters and would often see them multiple times a week while they took turns caring for their elderly mother.

Family meant everything to Larena. She loved visiting her two sons and their families and loved to spend time with her grandchildren. She was always willing to help in any way she could and loved being around for big family events.
