



## Lloyd D Peach

August 11, 1939 - November 17, 2025

Saint George, UT – Lloyd D. Peach, age 86, passed away peacefully on November 17, 2025, in Saint George, Utah. He was born on August 11, 1939, in Grand Junction, Colorado, to Wayne and Marjorie Peach.

Lloyd married Laura Elaine Turner on September 7th, 1962, in Grand Junction, CO. Together, they raised four children—Sue, Kim, Tracy, and Rob.
