Marcia Garner, wife of David H. Garner, passed away February 5, 2014. She has left a major void in the lives of her family. She was born Marcia Jean, daughter of Leland Evans and his wife Hortense Farr, in Pocatello, Idaho, Oct. 4, 1935.

She was raised in Arimo, Idaho, and graduated from Marsh Valley High School. She obtained technical training in Idaho Falls, and worked at the Atomic Energy Commission in Arco, ID.; during which time she served a stake mission for the LDS Church.

She met and married David, in the Idaho Falls Temple.
