Before immigrating to the United States of America she went to nursing school in Buenos Aires and graduated from the British Hospital School of Nursing. After completing her schooling she was called to be a missionary for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in Argentina when Argentina was only one mission.

She immigrated to Salt Lake City, Utah in 1961, and accepted a position at LDS hospital. Before taking her license to be a nurse in the United States she went to Westminster College in Salt Lake city to continue her education in Psychiatric care.

Maggie Met Roy Larsen, who was from Norway, at a LDS stake dance, and they were married just 10 days later in the Salt Lake Temple on February 1st 1968!
