Marian Lister Slack, age 81, passed away peacefully in her home on Friday, December 12, 2014, and joined her sweetheart Carlyle in their heavenly home. She was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, sister and friend, and will be deeply missed.

Marian was born August 4, 1933, to Marion Boyd Lister and Lola Smith Lister in Panguitch, Utah. She married Carlyle E. Slack on September 9, 1950; later solemnized in the St. George Temple April 17, 1959. Prior to Carlyle's death in October, 2010, they celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary.
