Our beloved Marilyn Hampel Lindsey passed away Friday, 15 November 2024, in her home in Washington, Utah, surrounded by family after her courageous battle with ovarian cancer. She was 70 years old.

Marilyn was born 10 January 1954 in Ogden, Utah, to Bruce Franklin Hampel and Emma Lucille Bush. She was the oldest of four children. Marilyn grew up in the shadow of Mount Ogden alongside her siblings Phyllis, David and Gary in the brick home their father built. She married Mark Lindsey on 31 July 1985 and was sealed in the Jordan River Utah Temple.

Many of her greatest experiences in life revolved around teaching in the classroom and at home with her own children. She taught in South Jordan and later at Westridge Elementary School. While there she became Vice Principal. She went on to get her masters from BYU and developed a writing program that was used in her school district. After raising her children, she returned to her love of teaching and taught at Lindon Elementary School.

Marilyn and Mark were blessed with their daughter Heather and two sons, Clark and David. Many of the treasured memories of her children surround the

educational experiences she created for them during the summer months. She was a life-long master teacher. The Lindseys spent several years living in Round Rock, Texas, where they made many friends and lasting memories. They moved back to Highland Utah to be near family.

Throughout her life she was a devoted member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She served in the Stake Young Womens, Relief Society, Scouts and Primary. She loved living close to a temple. She has always loved the Lord.

Later Mark and Marilyn moved to St. George to be near Marilyn's sister, Phyllis. Marilyn enjoyed watching the hummingbirds eat food out her window and see the geckos do pushups along her back wall.

Her loving survivors include her husband, Mark, and children Heather, Clark, David (Ari) and granddaughter, Emmalynn.
