



Mary Louise Young

December 18, 1928 - May 21, 2018

On May 21st, 2018 at 3:05 p.m., Mary L Young, 89, of Hurricane, UT, passed away at the Red Cliffs Health & Rehab facility.

Mary was born & raised in Texas where she eventually met and married her husband, Leon M Young, while he was serving in the US Army Stationed at Ft Bliss, TX. Upon His discharge from the army, Mary and Leon moved to New Mexico where they had their first two children, Inga & Maxine. They soon moved to Casper Wyoming where they lived until 1973, having had one more child, Michael and adopting another child Mark. While in Casper, she worked for the US Government as a census employee. In 1973 they moved to Ferron, UT and eventually made their way down to the St George and La Verkin areas in 1980 and then Las Vegas, NV in 1995. Mary moved back up to and settled in Hurricane, UT after the passing of her husband in 2005.

Mary is preceded in death by her husband of 59 years and all 4 of her children. Mary is survived by her 3 grandsons: Clifford Wilson (Las Vegas, NV), Tracy Staples (St. George, UT), George Tyson Staples (Payson, UT); 15 Great-Grandchildren; and 4 Great-Great-Grandchildren.

Mary's memorial service will be held on Wednesday, May 30th at 12 p.m., at the Hurricane LDS Church, 452 N 2600 W Hurricane UT 84737. Mary will be buried at the Hurricane City Cemetery with the rest of her family at 2 p.m. on
