



## Mason Lewis Pearce

December 9, 1942 - March 18, 2018

St. George, UT - Mason Lewis Pearce, age 75, passed away peacefully on March 18, 2018. He was born on December 19, 1942 to William Edward and Marguerett Woolley Pearce in Downey, CA.

Mason grew up in Southern California and the family moved to Ogden, UT where he completed his Senior Year at Weber High School, class of 1960.
