Necia was born December 11, 1937, in Richfield, Utah, to Noble and Zona Madsen Lee. She grew up in Monroe, UT, and graduated with South Sevier High School Class of 1956. She attended college at Utah State University where she met the love of her life, Alma Don Sorensen. After an 18 month courtship, they married on June 5, 1959, in the Logan LDS Temple. Together they raised six children: Jonathan, David, Matthew, Kathryn, Cynthia, and Necia Ruth "Ruthie".
