She always tried to help her younger siblings and would lend a listening ear and was very creative with art and colors at a younger age.

Peggy with her parents and siblings moved to Nampa, CA and then to Lowell, Oregon where she grew up in her teenage years and married, then moved to Mesa, Arizona to raise her children one of the Arizona happening Peggy had the kids pick prickly pear cactus then the kids and Peggy mashed them all together for a while. Then took a sheet and strained the pulp from the juice and made prickly pear jam and drank some of the juice it was good and a great memory. She had 6 children and adopted another raising her 7 children in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Peggy went on to attend school for nursing, Foot Reflexology, and then got her doctorate degree in Naturopathic Medicine. Mom loved helping others who were sick and would find natural remedies that would help people overcome illnesses. Some of our fondest memories was when Mom would sit down and have deep discussions about the gospel and what the scriptures meaning would be. This would lead David and Janet to cementing their testimony and serving a mission in the Washington Seattle mission. Peggy married Ed Krupp October 27, 2006 in Winnemucca, Nevada.

The Gospel played such an important part in Peggy's life as she enjoyed each

calling, she was given, and after her children were raised served multiple missions both when she was alone and then with her husband Ed. They served in Missouri and in Sweden as couple missionaries, then returned home and served as family history missionaries in Cedar City, UT. Aside from her faith in Jesus Christ she valued friends and family.
