the athletic, academic, and personal successes of his 2 boys, and loved coaching and cheering them on. He carried that passion on in loving and supporting his 5 grandchildren. Unfortunately, his time was cut short with his daughter, Allison, but we can only imagine the sweet reunion the two of them are having. Besides his family, he will miss his 3 Harley Davidson motorcycles, which he practically treated as members of the family. He truly lived to ride.
