Sandy Hampshire, age 78, passed away on January 3, 2016 in St. George, UT after a seven-year battle with multiple myeloma. She was born August 20, 1937 in Salt Lake City, UT to Alexander E. Taylor and Bertha June Hixson. She married Paul Hampshire in Salt Lake City on Sept 24, 1971.
