Starlyn refused to fess up no matter how much I denied my participation! It was days before she cleared my name. I'm not sure that everyone believed that she did it though. She was sneaky sweet that way.

I'm going to miss her so much. I will never look at Xanadu, Ax murderers, or wicked witches the same again. I will miss our movie nights and the pizza. I will miss our talks about books. About our families. About the gospel. Mostly I will miss her. I love you my friend. Goodbye for now.

And my wife Tamara & I have been friends — mostly from afar — with Jed & Starlyn for our entire married lives. I feel so happy and grateful that my friend Jed has been so well loved and cared for by this wonderful and gracious woman, Starlyn, who is the great and precious love of his life.

One thing I believe we can together say with first-hand knowledge, and absolute certainty — echoed in your beautiful comments here: we have all been greatly blessed by Starlyn's example and by her life of loving and friendly service to family and friends, of loving attention to others in her many spheres of influence, and of sharing tons of cheer with the world.
