Stephen A. Biniewicz was born in Rahway, NJ on September 24, 1943. He was the only child of Helen and Stephen. Steve lived 62 years of his life in the Woodbridge Township area of northeast NJ. He was an electrical engineer with BS and MS degrees in engineering. He also had a BS degree in psychology. He worked for several different engineering companies including Lockheed. Steve sent NASA shuttles into space and he is mentioned in the Smithsonian Museum for putting a probe on Mars. He ended his engineering career in 1999 and did numerous volunteer activities including serving on the Board as Commodore at Raritan Yacht Club. He spent numerous hours on his sailboat, Twice Blessed, and shared his expertise in sailing. In 2003 he took a position with the City of Perth Amboy as Harbor Master where he retired in 2005 and moved to Southern Utah.

He loved the red rocks and open vistas. Never really missing the ocean he spent many days on his fishing boat, Lil Red and teaching his granddaughter, Angel, to fish. He loved reaching out to the home bound in the area and was seen often on his motorcycle taking communion to fellow Grace Church parishioners and visiting the sick. As his disease progressed he became home bound but was on the phone reaching out to anyone who was depressed, lost or sad. Through all of his struggles, He walked the walk.
