



Steven Michael Bradbury

November 28, 1945 - February 24, 2015

St. George, Utah- Steven Michael Bradbury, aged 69, died in his home on February 24, 2015. Steve was married to the love of his life, Joanne Sime Bradbury, for 47 years. He is survived by his wife Joanne, sons Brian (Mary Kay) and Kent (Alisa) and daughters Terri (Luis) Perdomo and Erin Bradbury; eight grandchildren; sisters Lynn (James) Hanson and Karen (Doug) LeRoy and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents Russell Bradbury and Elizabeth Bradbury.

Steve was born in Los Angeles, California on November 28, 1945. He graduated from Alhambra High School, and then from Brigham Young University in 1969, majoring in linguistics. He taught sixth grade in inner city Cleveland Ohio for one year, and then attended Cornell University, graduating with a master's degree in Hospital Administration. Steve then began a successful career in hospital administration, leading health facilities in Hastings, Nebraska, Longview Washington, and Everett, Washington.

Steve was well-loved by his family, friends, and work associates for his quick wit and ever-present sense of humor. Steve and Joanne raised their family in Mukilteo, Washington, and later moved to St. George Utah. Although he suffered from a variety of health issues, Steve fought the good fight to the end, always relying on his faith in God and his love of family. Steve enjoyed researching his family genealogy, gardening, growing prize-winning dahlias,

ordering as-seen-on-TV merchandise, and feeding the birds. Steve, Dad, Grandpa- will be missed by all who knew him.
