“ One of my best blessings in life has, from the beginning, been to have Tom as my big brother. He is three years and two months older than me so he could tell me how things were and I would listen. That mentorship never stopped. Tom has always been there for Betty and me both. What a great man he became. He had so many jobs as a boy and carried a strong work ethic all of his life. I remember our Mom telling me that our town grocer, Mr. Parker, told her that Tom was the best sacker he had ever hired in all of his years operating his grocery store. Tom was only thirteen or fourteen when he worked for Mr. Parker. He hauled hay, he caddied at Southern Hills in the 1959 US Open won by Tommy Bolt, he delivered pizzas for one of Tulsa’s earliest pizza parlors, he sold vacuum cleaners door to door (very successfully) and finally found his career employer, Scott Rice, around 1962 or 1963, for whom he worked the rest of his active career. Tom was a stocker, a delivery man, an order filler, and eventually a salesman (a great one), the sales manager for a few years and then a salesman again. He was the absolute best that could have been at each and every one of the positions he held. His customers relied on him and grew to love him. Tom treated his customers as his extended family and was loved for his kindness and thoughtfulness. I remember my son-in-law, Jeff Barker, after going to work as an accountant at Helmerich and Paine years ago telling how he had heard that on a certain day a man would bring dough nuts for everyone and how on that day everyone would watch out for the “doughnut man”. That was Tom. And he was famous for thinking of ways to bring joy and kindness to his customers.

Tom showered the same generosity that touched his customers on Betty and me. He was always, and I mean always, concerned that I had enough to do what I needed or wanted to do. To my last day, I will be able to recall Tommy’s quiet but serious whisper, “Do you need any money”? He was a giver.

Over the years, we got in the habit of calling each other and inevitably we would get on the subject of Jenks, our activities there



from 1949 to the 1990's, the people we each knew, the highlights of our fishing together, our hunting together (and not getting shot by dad), our shared church experiences, crazy things that happened that we both knew about that would make us laugh until we wept with good humor. Man, the great phone conversations we would have. We shared our good times and our not so good times like good friends do. Tommy was not just my big brother, he was my best friend. I will always like him, even though he never did willingly stop teasing me about my Peter Pan doll. I will always love him because he was never anything but thoughtful and caring of me, his little brother. Thanks, Tommy, for always being there for me and for Betty and for Mom.
