



William Joseph Coyle

March 18, 1943 - July 11, 2013

St. George, Utah — William Joseph Coyle, 70, passed away near his home in St. George Utah, following a four year struggle with Parkinson's Disease.

He is survived by his wife of 30 years, Dorothy Flores Coyle; his son, John Coyle; his step-son Brick Eksten (wife Jane Eksten and grandchildren Meaghan and Cameron) of Uxbridge Canada; his daughter, Holly Kaye Tanner (husband Greg and grandchildren Tyler and Bryce) of California; his step-daughter Hope Yancey (husband George Yancey), and his close friends and family members.

Born and raised in Denver Colorado, the son of Betty and Lowell Coyle, brother Patrick Coyle (all of whom preceded him in death), he was a lifelong resident of Colorado until he joined the Navy in 1956.

In his early years he liked to shoot his rifle and explore the woods of Colorado Springs with his brother.

After serving with the Navy as a medic, Mr. Coyle had the opportunity to work in the pharmaceutical industry until he joined the Alameda County Sheriff's Department and trained to become a Deputy Sheriff. He remained with the Sheriff's Department and worked at North County and Santa Rita Jail until his retirement in 2000. During his service was given numerous commendations

for his professionalism and strong work ethic. He was very well liked by his coworkers and the inmates alike.

Mr. Coyle had a passion for running and did so until he was no longer able to.

He was as member and supporter of the St. George Catholic Church.
